Reversing the Curse!

The empty tomb story in John's gospel begins in darkness. Mary Magdalene is going to the tomb "while it was still dark" (John 20:1). The other gospel stories begin later when there is daylight. Mary arrives at the tomb and is jolted with fear when she finds that the stone had been removed from the entrance.

She runs off and finds Peter and the other disciple, "the one who Jesus loved" (20:2) and frantically tells them that someone has taken away Jesus' body and she doesn't know where they put him.

I want to pause for a second because something beautiful is emerging in this story that I don't want us to miss. John is showing us how Jesus' resurrection is a re-creation story. He's giving us some hints that point back to both the beginning of his gospel and also to the beginning of Genesis, the first book in the Bible.

How does Genesis open? "In the beginning..." (Genesis 1:1). And how did John open his gospel? "In the beginning..." (John 1:1).

What does Genesis say about the earth? "Darkness was over the surface of the deep" (Genesis 1:2). And how does our story open? "While it was still dark," Mary went to the tomb (20:1). We have darkness in Genesis, and darkness here in John.

And where is Mary standing? Where is the tomb located? *In a garden*. And where does the account of Adam and Eve take place? *In a garden*.

The story of Adam and Eve is one that began with life, but because of sin, ends with death. The story in this garden began with a death, but because of the goodness of God, ends with resurrection life.

The resurrection of Jesus reverses the curse from Genesis and re-creates the world.


And what did God do after he removed Adam and Eve from the garden? He placed a flaming sword and something else in front of the Tree of Life to protect it. What else did he place there? Angels! And who do we have sitting in the empty tomb dressed in white asking Mary why she is weeping? Angels!

Wouldn't it be cool if they were the same angels? Like God said to them, "Hey you two, I'm reassigning you. Your work here is done because I've abolished the barrier to the tree of life. In fact, my Son is the tree of life. Why don't you head on over to this new garden where something incredible just happened..."

We have been given the opportunity to help write the story of our world. The question is then...will we? It is my hope that over the last few weeks you have been able to own one or two of the helpful hints you can use in your relationship with Christ and then be able to share them with those that need to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ.

A PURPOSE FOR PAIN

Pain is an unescapable part of life but there are certainly some good things about it too. The bible also tells us there is a purpose for our pain. And it is up to us to decide what we are going to do with the pain that we are given. Imagine God as the gardener and yourself as a giant lavender plant. Pain is like a big pair of garden shears. If you know anything about lavender bushes you would know that it is necessary to cut them back so that they can bush out and grow thicker. Pain is like a learning tool that God uses to cut back the bad parts, like dead wood. Dead wood are things like spiritual immaturity, sin, and weakness.

Every time we experience a painful situation, we can see it as an opportunity for growth. Suffering can help us build trust and reliance on God if we let it. Suffering builds mental toughness. "For because he himself has suffered when tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted." (Hebrews 2:18) When we choose to do hard things, we get better at exercising self-control. God designed our bodies to benefit from doing hard things too. Our brain makes synonymic connections that make it easier to do hard things again. We can conclude that a mind and a body that is not trained becomes weak.

I think we can learn a lot from looking inward at ourselves and our own feelings. Think of every pain as an opportunity for growth. What are your weak areas as a Christian? Do you struggle to be kind to others? Are you angry? What can we learn from that anger? What is anger trying to teach us? Maybe that anger is teaching you nonconditional love for self and others. Anything you fear is teaching courage. Anything that has power over you can teach you where it is that your power lies, which should be in Christ.






March 24th Service begins at 9:30am


EASTER BASKETS FOR FOOD PANTRY!


