

## Monthly Matters with Pastor Troy

#### Living God's mission in our community.

1 Peter 4:7-11 tells us that 'God has called us out of darkness into his marvelous light with this purpose, to proclaim His excellencies. I will mention a couple of things about this phrase and then share with you the three things he tells us to do in response to this truth. First, this phrase, 'the end of all things is at hand' points to the time period we live in, the last days that was inaugurated with Christ's first coming and will be consummated when Christ returns. Peter tells us that in light of the time we live, live a practical, righteous life. It has been attributed to Martin Luther about the return of Christ, ""Even if I knew the world would end tomorrow, I would continue to plant my apple trees." Whatever you believe about the last things, the bible describes the last things to encourage us that God wins, and his people are to overcome or live righteously. Second, in the phrase 'all things,' Peter sees history as God's history; nothing is outside the influence of his Lordship, and he is bringing everything to the culmination of his ends. "There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign overall, does not cry, "Mine!" — Abraham Kuyper. It is because God is absolutely sovereign over all things that we can have confidence that he is ruling over history and that he wins.

Have you ever been so distressed or irrational that you could not think clearly or did not think to pray? Keep a clear head in the midst of suffering, difficulties, so that you can effectively pray to the Lord. The only appropriate response to suffering is to turn away from self toward the victorious Lord, who has defeated sin and Satan, and look to him for the resources to thrive and overcome in life. When you are down, do not look within but to him in prayer. Have you ever wondered why you don't pray? It is because we are intoxicated – with ourselves, with this life. With the end of all things, we are to keep a clear head; keep praying; and keep loving one another.

"Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins." In the midst of difficulties do not withdraw from community. 'Above all' shows that loving God's family is central to discipleship and is even evidence of saving faith. Peter says to love earnestly because love covers a multitude of sins. Where love abounds offenses are minimal, even overlooked and gossip is stifled. He tells us to love one another by showing hospitality and serving.

Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

1 Peter 4:10

Another way to show love is by serving one another. "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies-- in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen." This is addressed to every one of us, 'as each has received a spiritual gift, use it to serve one another.' God gives gifts to each of us for the benefit of others.

What if you don't know your spiritual gifts. There are tests you can take but the best way to determine your spiritual gifts is to find a need and meet it. Peter describes serving others with your spiritual gifts as being a good steward of God's grace. Gods sovereignly gives gifts as he chooses yet we are seeking for spiritual gifts and gifts are for building up the church, the body of Christ. How do you know if you are serving in the strength God supplies? I pray for strength and then serve with all I got. Am I serving in a way that draws attention to me or to God? In light of the end of all things we are to keep a clear head; keep praying; and keep loving one another – showing hospitality and serving others with our spiritual gifts.

The money donated from FCCW is used to help supply milk to families in our community. Rose gives out 28 gallons of milk every week!


#### ~ \$100 donated to New Life Meal Ministries in Huntington

## DEALING WITH ANXIETY

I was never an anxious person until I had my two girls Mia and Aria. The sudden responsibility brought a lot of stress, anxiety and worry to me because I knew I'd be in charge of keeping them safe and raising them. As the girls are growing, I'm realizing that there is no possible way for me to be able to keep them safe from everything. There is also no way that I could show up to be the perfect mother that they needed me to be. I have never ever been a mother before. And Mia has never been four before we are both learning and growing every day. We live in a crazy world and there just aren't any guarantees that any of us will be safe all the time. I worry thinking about anyone else watching the girls and something terrible happening and I'm not there for them. Or just yesterday I had a nightmare that the girls opened their bedroom windows and fell out. Even though I try my very best to keep the girls safe there are always things that could happen that are out of my control, and it would be impossible to prepare for everything because of how crazy our world is. When I'm anxious the only things I can do is first calm down, second pray about it, third seek a logical solution.

If I'm not thinking right because I'm emotional the thing to do is to sit down take a moment to breath and pray and calm down. Once you've gathered yourself it's a good time to pray and ask God to help you with everything that you are worrying about. You can ask him for help and tell him everything that's bothering you. If you are like me then you probably don't make good decisions when you are emotional. When I'm stressed and anxious I like to think of my favorite things that I like doing like hiking and nature. After we have taken some time to pray and calm our minds then we are ready to seek out a logical solution.

If I'm worried about the girls falling out the window, I can buy child locks to prevent them from opening them. If I'm worried about other people watching the girls, then I can make sure that only people I really trust get to watch them like their grandparents. There's nothing more important than my girls so I don't have to worry about being polite and I can be as awkward and weird as I need to be to get my point across. This applies to you kids too. When there is real danger, or you just feel uncomfortable don't be afraid to be as weird and stern as you need to be to get yourself out of the uncomfortable situation.

Another thing that makes me feel anxious and stressed is managing my responsibilities. As a mom I am responsible for a lot. I have to take care of my kids, my pets, my house, and my job all at the same time. Sometimes I feel so overwhelmed. I've also learned that I can be so hard on myself when it feels like I'm not doing a good job at any of it. Sometimes I feel like a bad mom, a bad wife, and a bad employee because I just can't seem to manage it all. Your stress is probably different than mine, but life is difficult for all of us. You have never been your age before, and I've never been my age before. We all go through difficult things that bring stress and anxiety. It helps me to remember that God is with me and that I get to turn to him ask his help and that he has promised to help me. He might not show up in the way that I wish he would, but I know he is always there and that he loves me so much. Nothing surprises God and he can handle everything, so it is best to give it to him and let the fear go because it just doesn't serve us it hinders us. Lastly if you are having a difficult time always talk to your parents and trusted loved ones about it.




## Service Opportunities


Let's make this a summer of service! Check the sign up sheet in the sanctuary and see where you would like to help!
